The course will also expose the students to a general discussion of project management techniques in the context of international development cooperation.

Therefore, in this course, leaderships of world leaders are studied; application of them to different community environment is discussed; and alternatives to manage and resolve conflicts in community, and to tackle problems in community are presented. In this process, characteristics of leaders are advanced to present how the community should be developed.

Also, current and controversial issues in international development and cooperation are selected for in-depth analysis.

And, it is concerned with finding plausible solutions in the field of public health, such as water-borne diseases, implementing law which promote adequate sanitation in urban, rural and recreational areas. This course involves wastewater management and air pollution control, recycling, waste disposal, environmental sustainability and public health issues as well as a knowledge of environmental engineering law.
